JDG students at H. B. du Pont Middle School partnered with the Kids Who Care Club and the Glee Club organizations to conduct a school-wide food drive for the Food Bank of DE. 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students competed against each other to determine which class would bring in the most canned goods. Students collected over 700 items to donate to the Food Bank of DE.

The Blanket Project

JDG students at Central Middle School are partnering with the Senators in Action Club to provide blankets for the needy during the winter months. The idea originated when the Senators in Action Club decided to provide blankets for an orphanage in Kenya. It grew

from there when Mr. Roach, JDG Specialist at Central Middle School, involved his JDG middle school students in the project.

The warm fleece material for the blankets is paid for with funds raised by the Senators in Action Club. Approximately eighty 7th and 8th grade students are involved in the project. There are several steps to produce each blanket; students work in teams of four to create each one.

Blankets will be delivered to The Shepherd Place, a homeless shelter in Dover, DE in early December. The two groups are determining what other organizations may have a need for such an item, and will continue to provide blankets for as many needy families as possible.
